How It Works

1. Become a fan of the Association of Consulting Engineering Companies (ACEC) Facebook Fan Page (www.facebook.com/ACECAFIC). Read contest details and criteria on [Facebook](#) or by scrolling down below.
2. Make a video of yourself explaining **“Why I want to be a consulting engineer”**. Visit www.engineeringlegacies.com for more information on consulting engineering.
3. Submit your video approximately 2-3 minutes before entries close **Wednesday, October 5, 2011 at 12:00 AM EDT** to the ACEC [YouTube Contest Page](#) by carefully following the steps below:
 - 1) Upload your video to YouTube.
 - 2) Confirm your submission by emailing nboudreau@acec.ca the link to your YouTube video. Include your name, university, engineering specialty, phone number and email in the correspondence.
 - 3) The video will then become a “favourite” video on the ACEC YouTube Channel upon being reviewed by ACEC.
4. Wait to hear if you won a ticket with airfare and 1-night’s accommodations to attend the 2011 Canadian Consulting Engineering Awards!

Criteria

1. **Contest begins officially on September 7, 2011 at 12:00 AM EDT and ends on October 5, 2011 at 12:00 AM EDT.**
2. **Participants must be enrolled in an engineering program at an accredited Canadian university. Undergraduate and graduate students are welcome to enter.**
3. **Must become a fan of the ACEC [Facebook Fan Page](#).**
4. **Overview.** The purpose of the contest is to get Canadian engineering students to submit a video depicting “Why (they) want to be a consulting engineer”. By submitting a video on the [YouTube Contest Page](#), you are agreeing to place your video online for public viewing. All entries will be screened for appropriateness and those deemed ineligible will be removed immediately. Each submission must answer the contest question clearly: “Why I want to be a Consulting Engineer”. Creativity and presentation skills will be taken into consideration. Participants are encouraged to do research on the industry of consulting engineering in putting together a convincing case. 5. **Prize.** The contest winner will be awarded a ticket to attend the [2011 Canadian Consulting Engineering Awards](#) in Ottawa, Ontario on November 1, 2011. In addition, the winner will receive profile in ACEC’s nation-wide newsletter *Source*, recognition at the Awards ceremony in Ottawa, and the video may be used for promotional purposes throughout the year. The [Canadian Consulting Engineering Awards](#) is a premiere industry event attended by leaders of the Canadian consulting engineering industry, industry officials and Canadian Members of Parliament. At the Awards Gala the contest winner will be given the chance to meet VIPs including ACEC Board Members and industry leaders, and Members of Parliament while enjoying an evening of fine dining and entertainment at the new Ottawa Convention Centre. The contest winner will receive one ticket to attend the awards, return airfare and one-night’s accommodations.
6. **Appropriate Language.** Videos must contain appropriate language (no profanities) or videos will be disqualified.
7. **Length.** Videos should be no longer than 3 minutes in length and should clearly answer the question **“Why I want to be a consulting engineer”**.
8. **Judging/ Judging Criteria.** Judging will take place on October 12, 2011. The judge’s panel will consist of leading consulting engineers, young professionals in the industry and experienced association professionals. Judges will vote on the following criteria:
 - ability to answer the contest question clearly;
 - ability to make a convincing case;
 - creativity and presentation skills

The video which excels in all identified criteria will win the competition.

9. **Disclaimer.** The intent of the contest is not to secure employment. The contest's objective is to foster a greater understanding of the Canadian Consulting Engineering industry, so that students may be aware of opportunities that exist for them in the industry upon graduation.

Note that the prize has no cash value and must be used to attend the [Canadian Consulting Engineering Awards](#). This prize is not exchangeable.
